Overcoming several injuries to key starters, the Miller football team, under the direction of head coach Frank Close, offensive coach Robert Searles, and defensive mentor Oakley Pandick, maintained a smooth functioning attack which merited a successful 4—3—2 record. The Blue, acclaimed by Close as his top defensive team in eight years, climaxed their season by downing a previously undefeated Verona eleven.

Millburn, which limited its opponents to 26 points in the first eight games of the season, became a team noted for its tough defense. Top interior line play by Lloyd Friend and Paul Boegershausen carried the Millers to three consecutive shutouts over Clifford Scott, Somerville, and Verona. In the latter two contests, the Blues managed their finest offensive performances. Behind the blocking of Fred Lambert, Co-Captains Jack Hohnstine and George Norman sparked an offense which was weakened by injuries. However, through the running of Hohnstine, who gained 160 yards against Verona, and the passing of Norman, who guided the Blues to their first win over Somerville since 1954, Millburn fashioned a creditable record.

However, the Blues could not hold off a spirited Madison team as the Dodgers broke an eight year jinx despite the play of Pete Lester and Dick Gallitelli.

#### BASKETBALL



Millburn's only weak point seemed to be in the hurdles. Charley Hitchins and high jumper Miles Tullo were scheduled to compete in this event.








# BASEBALL


## **TENNIS**




With their outstanding play in tournaments during the summer, the Millburn golf team could assure fans that it would be battling for the Conference title as well as its second consecutive State Championship.


